



#### A Message from our Past President...

As another year draws to a close, I think back on all the activities that the Blues Society has pulled off in 2014. Starting with 51 Thursday jam sessions (we took Christmas off), the Treasurer's Picnic, Music & Wine Festival, Mississippi Railroad, several blues shows, starting up the acoustic jam again and, finally the Christmas Party. It is truly an amazing amount of stuff for an all-volunteer organization to get done. So, my hat's off to all who stepped forward to help and congratulations on another outstanding year!

In addition, we have added lots of new merchandise, thanks to Betty Fenicle and Dave Yeagley, and have been making that available to blues fans at more venues. We have also released a new CD of the Center Stage show by WITF-FM with Terry "Harmonica" Bean, which includes many tunes that feature our local jammers, as well as the Cornlickers. The two-CD set includes interviews with Terry and 11 songs, mostly recorded at our 2013 Mississippi Railroad event.

Looking ahead, 2015 promises to be another great year. We have nearly completed the lineup for the Dauphin County Music and Wine Festival and it is a great one (more details to come), so mark your calendars for June 13th and 14th. We are working on bringing more touring artists to Harrisburg, starting with Joe Louis Walker on Sunday, January 18th, at the River City Blues Club - admission \$15. BSCP is sponsoring this effort and would like to do this kind of event regularly if we can break even on the cost. We have reserved the Shellsville Picnic Grounds for May 24th for our Treasurer's Picnic and for July 12th for the Mississippi Railroad. We made great progress last year in reducing the burden on our volunteers for these events, but we will still need many folks to step up and help, as they have done in the past. We usually have as much fun preparing for these events as we do attending them, so don't be shy, join in the fun!

I will be stepping down as President as of January 1st, and assuming the office of Treasurer. I look forward to working with Buster Grubb, our new President, one of our founding members and long-time Board Member and Vice President. Buster brings a vast amount of knowledge and experience to the job and I know he will do well. And want to especially thank Bob Emrich, our outgoing Treasurer, for his many years of service to the Blues Society. Bob has left the treasury in great shape so we have the means to continue to enjoy and promote the blues.

I also want to thank all the BSCP members who have been so supportive of me as President and Jam Chairman. Your support and friendship means more to me than I can express. Thank you.

## CD REVIEW STEVE CRASE "Buckle Up"

John in Houston PR is an online friend of mine and he does public relations work for many great blues artists. From time to time he sends new CD releases of the artists he represents to me for CD reviews. Lucky me! I get the chance to hear lots of new music ...and that's always a good thing!

The most recent CD that John sent to me is Steve Krase's latest disc, "Buckle Up". A little background of Steve Krase (rhymes with ace). Steve was born in Brooklyn, New York, before moving to Ohio, California and Louisiana before settling in Houston, Texas 20 years ago. Steve worked for several

prominent Houston based bands as a harmonica sideman before forming his own band, Steve Krase and the In Crowd. Steve and his band were local blues society IBC winners in 2004 and 2005, and they advanced into the finals at The Blues Foundations International Blues Challenge in Memphis both of those years.

"Buckle Up", released in 2014 on the Connor Ray Music label, is a 10-song project and each song features dynamic blues harp and powerful vocals by Steve backed by premiere Houston based blues musicians. So, fish those seatbelts out from alongside of the seat and buckle up as we ride through this CD!

"Joline" gets this CD started with fast early rock & roll styled boogie featuring rollicking piano and soaring harmonica. Glad we "buckled up" for this burner!

Whew! We'll slow the pace a bit with a slide guitar and harmonica smooth groove for 'Daddy's Got A Cadillac (Mama Rides A Mule)".

Steve Krase is joined in track three by Houston's blues diva, Trudy Lynn to belt out Willie Dixon's "I Just Want To Make Love To You". Trudy Lynn and Steve are no strangers to one another as Steve was a prominent player in Trudy Lynn's "Royal Oaks Café" CD which I reviewed in a previous BSCP newsletter. A little tip here...you can catch both Steve and Trudy Lynn in February at the Lancaster Roots and Blues Festival!

"Misery" is another fast number with lots of punch and plenty of Steve's vocals and harp!

We'll slow this thing down now with a smoky "Night Train (From Oakland)"...nice, relaxed and great for that slow dance with your sweetheart!

Track six, "Blueshound", is a song of a tragic highway accident with a fatality and references to the Grim Reaper. Lyrically, I didn't care much for this tune....a bit too morbid for me.

"I Like Them All" picks up the pace again with wailing harmonica and slashing slide guitar, while Steve sings of his interest in women!

"Buckle Up", the title track, speaks of the rough ride out of a failed relationship. Any of us that have been around the block a time or two can identify with this!

"Big Bad Woman" is a quick moving story type song and is the last speedster track on this disc.

Steve Krase ends this CD with a soothing tune featuring lots of harmonica and conga drum rhythms. Nice way to wrap this thing up!

One last reminder...Steve Krase and Trudy Lynn, both Houston, Texas powerhouses of blues music, will be here in Central Pennsylvania on February 6th & 7th for the Lancaster Roots and Blues Festival. For more details go to: <u>http://lancasterrootsandblues.com</u>.


swept over him like the storm surge ahead of an approaching hurricane.

Thank you, Mike, and everyone who came to the Christmas Party. It also wouldn't be possible to have these events without the blues fans. So while I have your attention, I would like to remind everyone that we have several annual events that are alike in many ways but there are also differences.

At every event, someone always says, "I thought you had food here." or "You don't have drinks." So if you haven't seen a poster or flyer at the jam, or read about it on the website or in the newsletter, please ask a Board Member. OK, here are the main events:

- TREASURER'S PICNIC \$20 in advance/\$25 door (prices subject to change). Food, soft drinks, coffee, water and draft beer are included. Food contributions are encouraged. Live music is provided all day.
- MISSISSIPPI RAILROAD PICNIC Free to Blues Society members. Bring your own food and drinks. We have had food for sale but it is not guaranteed. A blues act from Mississippi backed by the Cornlickers is provided.
- CHRISTMAS PARTY Free to Blues Society members. Food is provided. Coffee and water are available. Bring whatever else you like to drink. Food contributions are encouraged.

If you are not a member, it's a mere \$10 a year. If we have an International Blues Competition it is also free to members. If we have a New Year's Eve Party, it is at a reduced price to members. There are local blues societies who charge \$30-\$35 dollars for music and it does not include any food or drink and they get a very good turnout. We are extremely lucky to have such a successful organization that we can hopefully continue to give you an excellent time at a very reasonable cost.

I have had people ask me if our events are catered. The answer is yes, mainly by Virginia Ivanoff and Dot Grubb. Those ladies spend days shopping, storing, chopping and cooking. I'm not going to tell you how old they are, but I know Dot

will tell you her age...she's proud of it! We have a small core group of dedicated volunteers and we have many who will jump in to help for part of the time. We would like to get to know some of you better so please consider volunteering at any or all events.

"A lot of times, and probably most times, people never say anything, myself included, but don't ever think for even a minute that your efforts go unnoticed.
